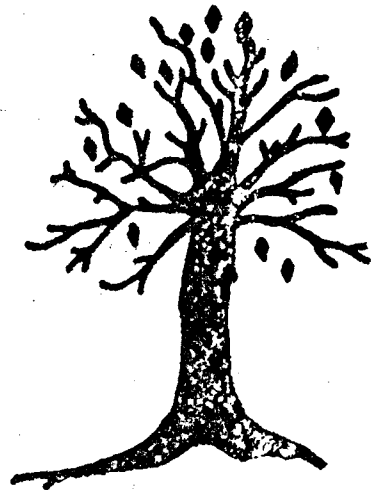

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FALLING LEAVES:

As this final issue of "Branches & Twigs" for 1972 is being prepared for publication we would like to note the tremendous strides forward which the Genealogical Society of Vermont has taken in its first year. There were 98 members when we held our first meeting last October. We adopted a constitution and by-laws, planned a quarterly publication, and elected Mrs. Carol Church editor and Mrs. Florence Lawson, archivist. Robert J. Tarte spoke of the Salt Lake City, Utah genealogical project.

In reviewing the program of our first year we recall one of the interesting features at the spring meeting was the exhibit of genealogical books provided by Mr. Jon H. Mayo, manager of the genealogical department of the Charles E. Tuttle Co. of Rutland, and the great amount of attention the display created. Also at this meeting Mrs. Abbott and Mrs. Nuquist spoke of the records available at the Vermont Historical Society. Later Mrs. Webster and Mrs. Hill gave an interesting talk on cemeteries in East Montpelier.

Our membership list is now over the 300 mark and still growing.

"Branches & Twigs" with only four publications has filled 63 pages, an index is now under consideration. A society library and a permanent have been established.

That's not a bad beginning for a new organization. Good luck to the Genealogical Society of Vermont, may it's second years accomplishments be as great as it's first.

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FALLEN LEAVES:

The Executive Board of the Genealogical Society of Vermont held their meeting August 19, 1972 at 10:00 A.M. in Randolph, Vermont, at the Vermont Technical College. It was presided over by President Leon Dean. Secretary's report read by Joann Heselton. Treasurer's report presented by Leo Fleury. We have a balance of \$218.36 plus \$10.00 in the Permanent Fund.

Mr. Dean spoke about the announcement to be sent for our next meeting in October. He suggested having our meetings set for the third Saturday in October and the third Saturday in May. Motion made by Joann Heselton, seconded by Leo Fleury to do this.

We discussed sending a copy of "Branches and Twigs" to Libraries for their files.

We will pay the dinner charge for the three speakers at our October meeting. Mr. Fleury will have his accounts audited at his bank.

We decided to have three vice-presidents. Names suggested: Justin Holden, Mrs. Marvel Swan, Mrs. Lois Burke, Mrs. Lincoln Jacobs, Sanford Witherell.

Florence Lawson and Joann Heselton to find a nominating committee around Brattleboro.

Mr. Dean suggested changing the by-laws; Article VIII, Gifts and Contributions; Section 2. Funds thus received, unless otherwise specified, plus any other funds recommended by the Executive Board and voted by the Society must be kept in a special account to be known as the Permanent Fund from which only the interest of such fund may be used at the discretion of the Executive Board. We decided to let this rest for a year.

We discussed the price to charge for selling individual copies of "Branches & Twigs." We voted to charge \$.50 a copy.

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BUDDING OUT:

New states represented on our membership list are Arizona, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania and Tennessee. We now have 32 states plus Washington D.C. plus Canada. That's nearly two thirds of our goal of all 50 states.

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Our next meeting will be October 21 at the United Church in Randolph. Reservations should be made for the chicken dinner at noon. Mrs. Alton Swan will speak on "Charting your Course", Mrs. Jacobs will talk about "Picking Up The Trail", and Mrs. Burke is going to speak on "Advertising For Your Ancestors". If time permits, Merton Sage will lead us in a question and answer period.

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In accord with action taken by the executive board our fall and spring meetings will be held annually on the third Saturday of October and May. We can circle these dates on our calendar.

Quote from a letter received by your Archivist---"The long awaited HISTORY OF COLRAIN, MASS. is now in preparation and will be ready by late fall, though the exact date is still uncertain. many photographs. It contains an extensive genealogical section of most of the families who came to COLRAIN before 1800, including Smiths, Millers, Stewarts, Thompsons, McClellans, Wilsons, Davenports, McGees, Johnsons, and many others. 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Copies of the long-awaited "History of Springfield, Vt. " by retired Army Maj. Gen. Keith R. Barney recently went on sale at the Springfield Art & Historical Society center on Elm Hill. The new History covers the years 1885-1961, a slight overlap from the last town history, Hubbard-Dartt's "History of Springfield, Vt. 1752-1895." Mr. Barney used a cutoff date of Aug. 21, 1961, the 200th anniversary of the town charter that was issued by Gov. Benning Wentworth from the Province of New Hampshire. This updated history book contains some 700 pages and may be bought for \$15.00.

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TREE STUMPS:

The following was sent to your Archivist by a good friend of our Society and deserves a place of HONOR. When but a girl of 13 years, she, instead of playing with the gang at recess, had slipped out by herself and made a record of the stones in the Halifax Cemetery nearby. The cemetery was somewhat at the back of the ELIAS PROUTY barn, near the road. Mr. and Mrs. PROUTY are buried in a plot above the road, fenced with a stone wall, and a stone (I believe). As she writes,--"Of course in those days reading back to check correctness, was unthinkable, and for that matter no one knew I had done it anyway. Probably "the gang" never gave it a thought as to where I was."

Rabecca, wife of Nathaniel Hawkins, died July 22, 1834, in her 58th year.

"ASLEEP IN JESUS" Ira Bryant, son of Col. & Mrs. A.W. Stanclift, died Nov.

29, 1864, aged 24 years. "PEACEFUL BE THY SILENT SLUMBER, PEACEFUL IN THE GRAVE SO LOW: THOU NO MORE WILL JOIN OUR NUMBER, THOU NO MORE OUR SORROWS KNOW, YET WE HOPE TO MEET THEE WHEN THE DAY OF LIFE IS FLED, AND IN HEAVEN WITH JOY TO MEET THEE, WHERE NO FAREWELL TEARS ARE SHED."

Roxa, wife of Col. Solomon Stanclift, died Oct. 14, 1836 age 36 yrs. "IS THIS THE FATE THAT ALL MUST DIE, WILL DEATH NO AGES SPARE, THEN LET US TO JESUS FLY AND SEEK A REFUGE THERE."

Col. Solomon Stanclift, died Jan. 11, 1886, age 78 yrs. 2 mos. Roxie, his wife, died Oct. 14, 1836, age 36 yrs.

Abigail, his wife, died May 2, 1900, age 84 yrs. 9 mos. 17 dys.

(Gratia Willard was sister to Daniel Willard)

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#### SPLINTERS:

SAGE in PLEASANT VALLEY, Cambridge, Vt. offers a few comments---He has found that a publication, MAINE LIFE, sometimes gives leads to Vermonters who disappear, and then turn up in other places. He believes the query of the TRASK family may have been the end result of a MAINE LIFE query he answered several years ago. Surprisingly it was found that the Maine TRASKS had connections in Vermont.

"It was quite a job in the old days to get to anywhere from anywhere, so sometimes if people started someplace they might get side-tracked going west--s happened twice now with queries to my knowledge--the folk quering thought the folk had gone to Massachusetts from Maine--but when I wrote of names I knew here in VERmont they found it was indeed Vermont where some of the folk were buried even though eventually the traveler had finally settled in Massachusetts. Winters are rough here at times and when the Vt. Mass. line

was surveyed they found that many farms thought to be in Vermont were actually just over the line in Mass.--Well, the old man they told about his farm-house being in Mass. rather than Vt. as he had believed replied, "Thank God for that there--as I don't believe I could of stood another Vermont winter."
